Handcrafted polki kadas by Raniwala 1881 and a ring by Jagdish Jewellers further accentuated her look, allowing each piece to shine without overwhelming the ensemble.

Kapoor's makeup was kept minimal yet striking, featuring her signature smoky eyes paired with nude lips. The unexpected pop came from her nails: a teal cat-eye polish that added a modern twist to the classic look.
