

Armani Group to Honor Giorgio Armani with Final Collections at Milan Fashion Week

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The upcoming **Milan Fashion Week** will carry a profound emotional weight, as the **Armani Group** confirmed that its scheduled shows will go ahead despite the recent passing of legendary designer **Giorgio Armani**.

The 91-year-old designer was later laid to rest in a private ceremony attended by family, friends, and close colleagues in **Rivalta**, near his birthplace of **Piacenza**.
