Meanwhile, minimal thread work, zari embroidery, or metallic buttons offer elegance without garishness. They lift the outfit yet remain refined.

Also, finishing touches matter—a pocket square, classic brooch, or minimalist timepiece complete the look. They don't steal focus.

Colours, Prints & Fabrics That Pop

Along with solid colours, try prints—geometric, floral, abstract—for bandhgalas. Meanwhile, let base garments remain muted for balance.

Moreover, textured fabrics reflect light and mood during evening festivities. Hence, linen mixes or jacquard surface look lively under lights.
