

Navratri 2025: Nine Colours & Their Significance

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Navratri marks nine divine days of worship. Also, each day associates with a specific colour and goddess. Colour choices carry deeper symbolism.

Day 1: White (Goddess Shailputri)

White begins the festival. It represents purity, calm, a simple start. Wear white sarees or kurtas. Meanwhile, add silver bangles for sparkle.

Day 2: Red (Goddess Brahmacharini)

Next is Red — bold and fiery. It stands for strength and energy. Dress in red lehengas, kurtas, or vibrant accessories. Gold complements red beautifully.

Day 3: Royal Blue (Goddess Chandraghanta)

Royal Blue comes with class and regal feel. It uplifts the mood with richness. Try statement blue Anarkalis or lighter royal shades. Let elegance speak.

Day 4: Yellow (Goddess Kushmanda)

Then, Yellow bursts with joy. It resembles sunlight and happiness. Wear yellow salwar suits or drapes. Pair them with gold or flower-garlands like gajra to brighten up.

Day 5: Green (Goddess Skandamata)

Day Five brings Green — refreshed, balanced, fertile. It signifies growth and prosperity. One can go with green fabrics and simple gold/silver accessories. Green feels steady.

Day 6: Grey (Goddess Katyayani)

Grey may seem muted. However, with the right styling, it feels sophisticated and calm. Use colourful embroidery or borders. Let grey under festive lights still shine.

Day 7: Orange (Goddess Kalaratri)

Orange kindles vibrance on Day Seven. It is fierce, energetic, festive. Wear bold orange kurtas or lehengas. Dance under lights feeling radiant and bold.

Day 8: Peacock Green (Goddess Mahagauri)

Peacock Green blends green and blue tones beautifully. It feels dramatic, fancy, magical under evening lights. Accessories in oxidised metals or gold pair well. Make a striking entrance.

Day 9: Pink (Goddess Siddhidatri)

Lastly, Pink ends Navratri on sweet, playful note. It radiates cheer and softness. Go pastel or hot pink depending on mood. Keep jewellery light and smile brighter.

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
