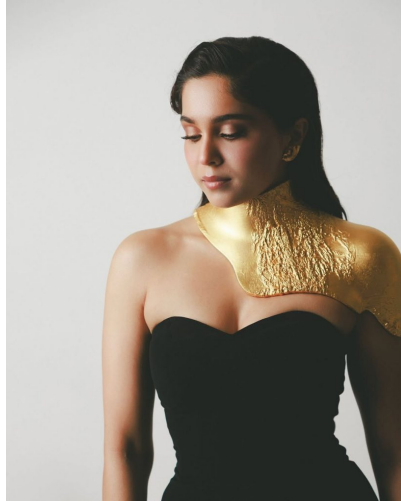


Sharvari Transforms Jewellery Into Armour at Vogue India's FOF 2025
