## **Style Team & Creative Details**

The fashion direction was helmed by stylist **Karl Templer**. Hair styling was done by **Guido Palau**, while makeup was by legendary **Pat McGrath**. Carpenter appears in pieces that evoke boudoir sensibilities—silk, lace, lingerie-details—paired with major Italian designers. Her hair is styled in a striking new long bob ("lob") with a flippy volume reminiscent of '60s and '90s glam.

## Reflective, Bold in the Interview

In the interview, Carpenter reflects on femininity, identity, and creativity. She describes femininity as "not a mask but an experiment, a shifting character I can write and rewrite every day." She also speaks of community and growth—how the people around her have accompanied her rise over the past decade. Her sense of style emerges as deeply tied to authenticity, experimentation, and evolving self-expression.

Therefore cover comes at a high point: Carpenter's recent album *Man's Best Friend* has gained strong traction. She's just wrapped up festival shows and is gearing up for the *Short n' Sweet Tour* in cities like Austin, Nashville, Pittsburgh, and New York. Finally issue of *Vogue Italia* will hit newsstands on **September 26, 2025**.
