When asked about her embrace of maximalism in today's minimalist-leaning fashion scene, Monika explains: "Minimalism has its beauty, but for me, a bride deserves to feel larger than life. Indian weddings themselves are maximal—the emotions, the rituals, the grandeur. Bridal attire should reflect that."

The Last Dance spans bridal lehengas, cocktail gowns, and dramatic evening silhouettes versatile enough for receptions, destination weddings, and even red-carpet moments. "I always suggest styling them minimally—let the outfit do the talking," Monika advises. "A statement earring, hair pulled back, and makeup that enhances natural radiance is all it takes."

Honouring the Hands Behind the Magic

The collection's intricacy is powered by master artisans from **Lucknow**, **Jaipur**, **Bihar**, **and Delhi**, many of them second or third-generation specialists in **zardozi**, **mirrorwork**, **and hand embroidery**. Their craftsmanship brings Monika's vision alive, weaving heritage into high couture.

A Collection Rooted in Myth, Elevated by Modernity

Months of research, sketching, draping, and structural experimentation went into this edit. Temple architecture, goddess iconography, and Western corsetry techniques converge with Indian hand-embroidery to create pieces that feel timeless yet contemporary.

For today's brides, Monika believes the priority is individuality and comfort: "They don't want to blend in, but to stand apart. They want couture that lets them feel regal yet still allows them to dance, move, and celebrate."
