Further, **Anthias** unveils its latest line, while **Madame Sibarita** introduces an oriental-inflected collection. The evening is slated to close with **Leffers**, offering refined, conscious elegance.

Day two promises architectural silhouettes from **Ramelle**, creative flourishes from **Maison Mesa**, and socially aware designs from **Leticia Valera**. As night falls, **Duly Romero** presents artisanal couture, and **Miguel Llopis** closes the fashion week in haute couture style.
