

# Chanel by Matthieu Blazy: A New Era of Elegance with a Playful Twist

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The house of **Chanel** turned a new page this Monday evening at the **Grand Palais**, unveiling the **first collection by Matthieu Blazy** as its creative director. Under the cosmic glow of planets suspended in a nocturnal setting, the designer introduced a vision of the **modern Chanel woman** — **grounded in the present yet inspired by the maison's timeless codes**.

The look paid homage to the 1920s spirit of female empowerment, encapsulated in Chanel's iconic quote:

"A woman who cuts her hair is about to change her life."

In true Blazy fashion, the image featured subtle yet striking details — **feathered earrings blending into the hair**, a motif that continued throughout the show. Captured by **David Bailey**, the campaign echoed the minimalism and nonconformity that defined both Bailey's photography and Chanel's spirit.
