How Lash Painting Works

Instead of sweeping on excess mascara, lash painting involves painting individual lashes from root to tip.

You begin at the base of your lashes, giving a subtle "tightline" effect.

This technique darkens the roots without making the tips look overloaded.

For bottom lashes especially, the precision of a fan brush helps avoid smudging—a common problem with standard mascara wands.

With practice, the extra time added to your routine is negligible—perhaps just a few seconds.

Why It's Worth Trying

- No clumps: The method ensures mascara doesn't bunch up.
- Cleaner finish: Each lash gets defined without excess.
- Any mascara works: The fan brush is compatible with all formulas.
- **Greater control**: Especially useful for bottom lashes and detailed application.

Favorite Tools & Tips

Bhatia recommends brushes like the PAC Fan Brush and Europe Girl Cosmetics Double End Lash Fan Brush as her top picks.
