Prioritize Weight & Comfort

- If your attire is heavy (borders, embroidery), lean toward simpler filigree or oval designs.
- For simpler outfits, you can afford to go bold (umbrella, peacock, open wings).

Metals, Stones & Finishes

Gold tones are standard, but mixing in **semi-precious stones** or contrasting finishes (matte + polish) is becoming more popular. These small variations make each pair distinctive.
