

Emma Stone Stuns in Sheer Knit Gown at NYC Premiere

At the New York premiere of her new film Bugonia, held at the Museum of Modern Art (MoMA), Emma Stone made a memorable fashion statement. She arrived in a daring yet refined look — a sheer knit gown from Louis Vuitton's Spring/Summer 2026 collection. Thus the dress featured wavy-seam detailing and contrasting stone-grey tones.

The Dress & Styling Details

- The gown is a spaghetti-strap design, made entirely of a light-grey knit fabric. Its emphasis is on transparency and texture: the sheer nature of the knit reveals subtle glimpses of what's underneath, while dark grey seam lines create wave-like visual movement.
- Underneath the sheer gown, Stone wore high-waisted pale-blue underwear (or briefs) that were intentionally visible through the fabric—adding a playful, modern edge to the look.
- Accessories were minimal: she styled her hair in an elegant up-do (with her shorter bob length), wore delicate
 jewellery. Therefore carried a matching Louis Vuitton bag in grey with silver hardware which complemented the
 dress.
- Her makeup and styling reflected the dress's modern minimalism: clean skin, understated glam. Whereas letting
 the dress be the focal point rather than over-embellishing.

Why This Look Works

- **Trend-forward material & silhouette:** The choice of a knit-fabric gown (rather than classic satin or heavy embellishment) signals fashion evolution—soft, wearable texture meeting red-carpet glamour.
- Sheer dress as statement: The transparency, paired with visible underwear, acknowledges and participates in the "naked dressing" trend in a tasteful way. It's bold without being overtly provocative.
- Colour and tone: The stone-grey palette is subtle yet strong. It defies the usual red-carpet bold colours, giving the look a modern and sophisticated feel.

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
