4. Stylish woolen coats are for the win

Who says you can't throw a long winter coat over a saree? A **woolen trench or over-coat** draped open over your saree adds warmth *and* elegance. Pair it with a scarf for extra texture and rustic charm. According to the guide, this look is a comeback from earlier generations and is trending again.

5. Time to take out the leather jacket

For a street-style twist, pair your saree with a **matte-finish leather jacket** (black or brown). This one's for the bold: it gives your ethnic drape an edgy, modern-baddie vibe. Hence contrast between the softness of the saree and the toughness of leather creates a striking fashion statement
