#### Building the Label "Vaishali S"

Vaishali launched her label, **Vaishali S**, in 2001 with a vision to bring traditional Indian weaves into the global luxury conversation. Her philosophy was simple yet profound—every fabric has a story, and fashion is the art of narrating it beautifully.

She began collaborating with handloom weavers from across India, including Chanderi, Maheshwari, and Khun artisans. Each of her collections reflected a dialogue between heritage and innovation, combining handwoven textiles with contemporary silhouettes. Over time, her work attracted attention for its quiet elegance and commitment to sustainability.

#### **Paris Haute Couture Debut**

Vaishali made history in 2021 when she debuted at **Paris Haute Couture Week**, becoming the **first Indian woman designer** to showcase on that prestigious stage. Her collection celebrated Indian craftsmanship through sculptural drapes, intricate weaving, and architectural design.

The moment was more than just personal achievement—it symbolized a new era for Indian handloom on the global map. Critics praised her presentation for balancing technical mastery with cultural depth, while fashion enthusiasts saw it as proof that couture could be both global and deeply rooted in tradition.
