By combining handwoven textiles and ethical production techniques, Sheena ensures that the brand remains grounded in authenticity. Furthermore, her partnerships empower artisans and celebrate slow fashion, showing that beauty and responsibility can coexist harmoniously.

Fashion that Adapts and Transcends

One of Sheena's defining design philosophies is adaptability. Each Abacaxi garment is envisioned to transcend occasions and environments — seamlessly transitioning from city streets to temple ceremonies, from baby showers to vibrant club nights. This fluidity mirrors modern life, where fashion must be as dynamic as the people who wear it.

Additionally, Sheena explores concepts like *reversibility* and *up-cycling*, creating versatile pieces that can be worn in multiple ways. This design approach encourages conscious consumption, inviting wearers to cherish and reimagine their clothes instead of discarding them.

Honouring Heritage Without Exoticism

For Sheena Sood, Indian craft is not a relic of the past — it's a living, evolving language of expression. She draws inspiration from traditional forms, but her intention is never to exoticise them. Instead, she integrates heritage techniques into silhouettes that feel current, comfortable and global.

Her reverence for the sari exemplifies this balance. Calling it "the ultimate garment," Sheena views the sari as a symbol of timeless adaptability — a single piece of fabric capable of infinite draping possibilities. Through Abacaxi, she extends

that philosophy to modern clothing, merging craftsmanship with versatility.
