

Ritwik Khanna Launches Rkive City Repair Shop in Bombay

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Leading Indian sustainable fashion designer Ritwik Khanna has opened a **unique Rkive City repair shop** on Perry Cross Road in the Bandra neighbourhood of Mumbai. The new 400-square-foot space is positioned not just as a retail outlet but as an interactive hub that **gamifies clothing repair and sustainable fashion practices**.

Rkive City — Khanna’s Delhi-based design and research house — focuses on upcycling post-consumer textiles and redefining traditional fashion consumption through a “re-wear, repair, and reconstruct” ethos. The brand has gained recognition for its innovative approach to circular fashion, including zero-waste manufacturing methods and transforming discarded garments into contemporary pieces.

Located in one of Mumbai’s most vibrant style districts, the Perry Cross Road shop invites customers to engage hands-on with sustainable fashion practices. Instead of simply purchasing ready-made garments, visitors can bring in old or discarded clothing to be **repaired, customised, or reconstructed** into refreshed pieces — all under the guidance of Rkive City’s team.

Khanna’s work extends beyond repair and upcycling. His brand has been featured on major sustainable fashion platforms and has showcased collections digitally at international events, including *Milan Men’s Fashion Week*. Through Rkive City, he champions a **circular systems mindset**, aiming to educate consumers about extending the life of garments and reducing the fashion industry’s environmental footprint.

The Perry Cross Road location marks Rkive City’s first dedicated public repair space outside its Delhi atelier, offering Mumbai’s fashion community a chance to experience mindful wardrobe stewardship firsthand. By blending physical interaction with sustainability narratives, Khanna hopes to inspire broader participation in circular fashion practices.

This concept comes at a time when sustainable fashion is gaining traction across India, with designers and brands increasingly focusing on craftsmanship, upcycling, and circular systems as core pillars of their work. Rkive City’s shop adds a **practical, experiential dimension** to that movement, making ethical fashion more accessible to everyday consumers.

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
