

Indian Group Pratibha Set to Invest in Spain's Hallotex Textile Business

In a significant move for the global textile sector, **Spanish textile manufacturer Hallotex** is finalising an agreement to bring **India's Pratibha Syntex** into its shareholder structure. The deal, which industry sources say is expected to be concluded in the coming weeks, marks a deepening collaboration between two long-standing supply partners and aims to position both players for broader international growth.

From Collaboration to Capital Partnership

Hallotex — headquartered in *Mataró, near Barcelona* — has been a major inter-supplier for international fashion brands, serving clients such as *Inditex* and *Mango*. Its operations extend across design, sourcing and manufacturing, with a strong production footprint in *Morocco* where it maintains vertically integrated facilities including weaving, dyeing and garmenting.

For years, Hallotex and *Pratibha Syntex* have collaborated to serve global customers. Now, that relationship is evolving into a *capital investment*, making Pratibha a shareholder in Hallotex's broader textile enterprise. While the exact *equity stake* Pratibha will take has not been publicly disclosed, the partnership is designed to foster joint growth and strengthen their competitive position in global markets.

Pratibha Syntex: India's Knitwear Powerhouse

Pratibha Syntex is a major player in India's knitwear segment, with a diversified portfolio and global reach. The company — based in *Pithampur, Madhya Pradesh* — operates across the textile value chain and employs thousands of workers. Over time, it has expanded from spinning into fabrics, dyeing and garment manufacturing, catering to brands and buyers in more than 40 countries worldwide.

Growth Strategy with a Global Vision

For Hallotex, bringing in Pratibha as an investor is part of a broader strategy to build a *textile group with true global scale*. The Spanish company, which began operations in the 1990s and later emphasised sourcing and fashion collection services for third parties, has chosen to diversify beyond its traditional bases by deepening international collaboration — particularly with partners in *Morocco and India*.

Hallotex's leadership under the Bonareu family remains intact, with the current management committed to steering the business forward even as the ownership structure evolves.

Industry Impact and Future Prospects

The alliance comes at a time when the global textile industry is increasingly shaped by cross-border partnerships and supply-chain realignment. Both Hallotex and Pratibha are expected to leverage this tie-up to serve existing clients more effectively and to compete for new business in Europe, Asia and beyond.

As the agreement is finalised, analysts will be watching closely to see how this partnership influences production networks, capacity expansion and innovation — with potential implications for competitors and buyers across the fashion and apparel markets.

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
