

## Indian Designers Make Global Mark at Paris Haute Couture

In contrast, Rahul Mishra's collection **'Alchemy'** took inspiration from the **five natural elements**—earth, water, fire, air, and ether—reinterpreted through painstaking hand embroidery, texture, and motion. Debuting on January 26, the couture line translated elemental philosophy into garments using intricate beading, flowing tulle, and richly detailed couture craftsmanship.

Highlights included swirling silver and blue pieces mimicking weather systems, flame-inspired embroidery in vibrant orange, and a striking finale gown reminiscent of cosmic nebulae rendered in deep blues and mauves. Rooted in both ancient Indian philosophy and scientific ideas about humanity's connection to the universe, Mishra's work offered a poetic meditation on transformation and life's cyclical nature.

Mishra's couture also emphasized the **handmade purity of couture**, showcasing the result of close collaboration between his ateliers in India and Paris and reflecting thousands of artisanal hours spent on intricate details.
