

BLACKPINK's Lisa Pays Fashion Tribute to Queen Sirikit

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In a striking blend of fashion and cultural homage, **BLACKPINK's Lisa** recently captured global attention with a couture moment that went beyond glamour to reflect deep national pride and heritage.
