

## Romantic Craft and Couture: Manish Malhotra's Dubai Finale

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Dubai Fashion Week concluded with a breathtaking finale as acclaimed Indian designer **Manish Malhotra** brought his latest haute couture collection to the front row of the international fashion calendar. ### **Bollywood Meets Couture: Kriti Sanon Shines**

One of the night’s most talked-about moments came when **Bollywood star Kriti Sanon** walked the final runway as the **showstopper**. Dressed in an elegant all-white outfit adorned with pearls and refined detailing, Sanon’s walk underscored the collection’s theme of timeless romance blended with modern luxury.

Malhotra’s choice of Sanon — who seamlessly bridged traditional design with a contemporary aesthetic — exemplified his vision for the collection: *fashion without rigid rules, where heritage and individuality coexist*.

In conversations following the show, Malhotra described this finale as more than just a fashion presentation — calling it a celebration of **artisans and the cultural threads that bind his work**. The silhouettes showcased a deeply textured surface play, with rich embroideries, crystal work, and beaded accents that gave each piece an expressive visual depth.
