

FDCI India Men's Weekend 2026 Celebrates Nostalgia, Utility and Opulence

- Other designers translated folk tales, traditional embroideries, and architectural motifs into menswear that balanced craftsmanship with wearable modernity.

Across the collections, there was a clear celebration of Indian textile heritage and artisanal detail — from delicate surface work to imaginative silhouettes — all while keeping global relevance and practicality in focus.
